“Get Involved” Awards

The 14th Annual Cornucopia Luncheon on November 5th will honor individuals, businesses and groups for outstanding volunteerism and community service with “Get Involved” Awards. **Nominations are due by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 1st, 2010.**

Nomination Information & Instructions

Individuals, groups, agencies and businesses may make one nomination per category.

Please read the descriptions below to determine which category best fits your nominee. All nominations must include a completed nomination form and a nomination statement explaining why the nominee is deserving of the award for which they are being nominated. Though not required, two letters of support from a nominee’s references may be included as well.

Nomination Criteria

Any individual or organization engaged in voluntary activities may be nominated. The volunteer activity can be in a structured or unstructured setting; must be nondiscriminatory; must demonstrate community impact; and must be performed in Lubbock or the surrounding South Plains area during the past 12 months (with the exception of the Diekemper Lifetime of Service Award).

All entries and attachments become property of the Volunteer Center and will not be returned.

The Volunteer Center of Lubbock, the media, or our sponsors may use any material submitted for publication.

Nomination Categories

-Individual Community Service:

A person who has demonstrated exceptional community leadership and involvement as a volunteer.

-Young Adult: A young adult (under 35) who has made a positive impact on the community showing dedication to a specific organization or cause.

-College: Collegiate group or individual exemplifying outstanding volunteer efforts, involvement in the community, and dedication to service.

-Youth: Group or individual (high school and/or middle school student) who has provided broad and exceptional leadership or direct service to a cause, program or project; or who has excelled in quality, spirit and length of service to others.

-Child(ren): Group or individual (elementary aged or younger) who has provided broad and exceptional leadership or direct service to a cause, program or project; or who has excelled in quality, spirit and length of service to others.

-Family:

A family exemplifying outstanding volunteer efforts, involvement in the community, and dedication to service.

-Business: Businesses that have demonstrated commitment to the community through active programs of volunteer service. One small business (less than 100 employees) and one large business may be chosen.

-Volunteer Coordinator: An individual (paid or unpaid) within a nonprofit organization who has contributed substantially to the encouragement and nurturing of volunteerism as a volunteer coordinator or manager.

-Cultural Diversity: Group or individual who has demonstrated a strong commitment to promoting cultural diversity in our community.

-Education: Group or individual who has created innovative and effective education and/or tutoring program, or provided significant volunteer service in the education sector.

-Arts: Group or individual who has demonstrated personal dedication to a specific arts organization or cause.

-Louise Cummins Outstanding Agency or Organization Award: Volunteer group that has been instrumental in designing or creating a program or project that meets community needs, and in doing so, has demonstrated extraordinary initiative and originality.

-Diekemper Lifetime of Service Award: An individual who has demonstrated a lifetime commitment to the community through volunteer leadership and service.
